Who Are We ... 37-50!

Gator Robotics, Team 3750 (fondly known as 37-50), began their official season on January 7 after attending the event kick-off at Digi-Key in Thief River Falls. There they received their Kit of Parts to begin their robot build. The build season ended on February 21 giving Team 3750 only six weeks and three days to design, fabricate, build, and program a robot for this year's competition entitled Steamworks.

The team consisting of 15 students, 6 mentors, and Head Coach Valerie Truscinski traveled to Duluth, Minnesota, on March 1 to compete in the Lake Superior Regional held at the Duluth Entertainment Convention Center (DECC). The competition spanned over three days, with day one being practice rounds. After the completion of the first full day of qualifying rounds, Team 3750 found themselves sitting with a record of 4-1 and in 9th place out of 63 teams competing. With much anticipation of another successful day ahead of them, the scouting team and drive team spent several hours going over stats in order to compile a list of other teams to choose for an alliance if that opportunity arose. Saturday's qualifying rounds did not go as well as the team had hoped, winning only one of their three rounds. This gave them a final record of 5-3 for the two days of qualifying rounds. Once the qualifying rounds were complete, the team was sitting in what they thought was a respectable position -18^{th} place. Unfortunately, Team 3750 did not get chosen for an alliance for the elimination tournament, and their journey ended prematurely.

Coach Truscinski remarked, "Over the course of the three days, Gator Robotics had many successes. Tessa Sanden, team Safety Captain, earned the Star of the Day award from the Regional Safety Committee. Our Junkyard Robot placed second overall. And I want to thank everyone involved with making that happen. The lunch ladies saved cans for us, team members brought in recyclables, and Alex Truscinski donated gears off of his wrecked racecar to bring 'Bolts' together. Shayna Kruger and Caity Garten designed our Junkyard Robot, and Emma 'Sparky' VonEnde was in charge of the build. On top of those milestones, our robot was on an alliance that was the only alliance throughout all of the qualifying rounds to get all of the gears placed and all four rotors turning with over 30 seconds remaining in the match! But, most importantly, we grew as a team, making many memories that will last a lifetime! We had an exceptional year with having a new coach, plus 5 out of 6 mentors and three-quarters of our team was also new this year! We had in inexperienced build team, drive team, and programming team, and we still finished 18th out of 63. Things will only get better in the years to come!"

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Ramp-Up Topics for March

GRADE 6: Students will be experiencing the Personal Readiness Evaluation for postsecondary inventory for the first time in their Ramp-Up careers. After completion, students will explore their personal results. Sixth graders will also make updates to their Readiness Rubrics after the completion of 3rd quarter.

GRADE 7: One element of a student seeing himself or herself as college going material is a belief in his or her own abilities. This unit encourages students to identify their individual strengths in terms of knowledge and skills needed for college so they can further create an understanding and belief in themselves as college going students. Also, students will be preparing for a panel of college students to ask questions regarding what college has been like for them. Upon completion of 3rd quarter, students will update their Readiness Rubrics.

WORKSHOP: Guest Speakers on College

GRADE 8: Advisory sessions in March will focus on the costs of college, whether it is a two-year or four-year school, private or public. A good link for parents to investigate is *https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/compare-colleges* to find out more about colleges and financial aid packages. Different colleges offer different financial aid packages and sometimes the more expensive colleges offer the best financial aid packages. The "sticker price" is not always the final price. Students will update their Readiness Rubrics after the completion of 3rd quarter.

GRADE 9: During March, students will be introduced to 21st Century skills. Special attention will be given to Career and Technical Education class opportunities within our school and in the postsecondary field. Upon completion of 3rd quarter, students will update their Postsecondary Plans and Readiness Rubrics.

GRADE 10: Sophomores will be investigating what really "sparks" their interests so that they can consider what career and postsecondary experience may be the best fit for them. Knowing about these sparks can be a great opportunity for parents to start a discussion about their student's postsecondary plans. Parents can find more information at *http://www.search-institute.org/sparks*. Readiness Rubrics will be updated following the completion of 3rd quarter.

GRADE 11: Juniors will be working on finding the right postsecondary fit. Students will use tools to begin to narrow their postsecondary options based on criteria like majors offered, type of degree program, school demographics and more. Both 2-year and 4-year colleges are explored within the advisory sessions. Juniors will have the opportunity to update their Readiness Rubrics as well.

GRADE 12: Seniors will prepare for a panel of current college students to find out what the reality of college is like. Students will look at an interesting survey of first year's college students that reveals aspects of the college experience that may not have been anticipated, and the challenges they face. *WORKSHOP:* College Panel

Ingredients:

1 egg ³/₄ cup milk

- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup quick cooking oats
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 pound ground beef
- 2/3 cup ketchup
- ¹/₄ cup packed brown sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon prepared mustard

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F



2. In a large bowl, combine the egg, milk, cheese, oats, and salt. Add the ground beef, mixing well, and form this mixture into eight miniature meatloaves. Place these in a lightly greased 9x13 inch baking dish.

3. In a separate small bowl, combine the ketchup, brown sugar, and mustard. Stir thoroughly and spread over each meatloaf. 4. Bake, uncovered, for 45 minutes.
