Why did you choose to play this instrument? I was the only one that played it from 8th grade.


What is your most memorable moment in band? When Logan played so loud.



Ramp-Up February 2015

Ramp-Up for Readiness students will investigate the following topics during the month of February. Parents should feel free to use these as specific discussion starters about the Ramp-Up activities and workshops held during the month.

GRADE 6 – *Personal Readiness Evaluation for Postsecondary (PREP)*. This unit provides students with their first experience with PREP, something they should complete twice during the next couple of years. The design of the unit is for students to become engaged by their results before actually getting them. They take the PREP with a minimal explanation, and then predict how the other students in their group answered selected questions.

WORKSHOP: Ways to Pay for College

GRADE 7 – *Knowledge and Skills that Build Belief*. One element of a student seeing himself as college going material is a belief in his or her own abilities. This unit encourages students to identify their individual strengths in terms of knowledge and skills needed for college so they can further create an understanding and belief in themselves as college going students.

GRADE 8 – *Exploring the Right Postsecondary Fit*. This unit introduces students to factors to consider when they are exploring what may be the best postsecondary fit for them. Types of colleges and majors are discussed. Students are not expected decided on a college, but simply to explore options, and learn that the availability of majors they are interested in should be a primary factor. *Budgeting for Teenagers*. This unit on budgeting is intended to give students an idea about their own spending and savings habits. Students learn the definition of a budget, and set up their own budget.

WORKSHOP: Understanding Your EXPLORE Career Possibilities.

GRADE 9 – *Understanding Decision Making*. In these activities, students are taught five phases of decision-making (Clarification, Brainstorming, Evaluation, Decision, and Double Checking). These phases are something that can be applied to all sorts of decisions and will be useful far beyond 9th grade.

WORKSHOP: Global Knowledge Economy

GRADE 10 – *Access vs. Success*. This unit helps students understand that just gaining admittance to college will not guarantee graduation. *College Entrance Exams: ACT, SAT*. Students will review website and app resources used to study and prepare for these tests, and learn what these exams measure.

WORKSHOP: Understanding Your Plan Score.

GRADE 11 – *Finding the Right Postsecondary Fit*. In this unit, students get the time and opportunity to really begin narrowing their postsecondary options based on specific criteria like majors offered, type of degree program, school demographics and more. Both 2 and 4 year colleges will be explored.

GRADE 12 – *Building a Budget*. While many students have had some exposure to some money management in high school, this unit focuses on thinking about the money they earn and spend now, and the money that they may need to earn to spend in college.

WORKSHOP: Personal and Social Skills for Post Secondary Success.
