Badger High School Nominates Klegstad and Truscinski for 'Triple A' Award

Badger High School recently announced it has nominated Logan Klegstad and Madison Truscinski for the Academics, Arts, & Athletics (AAA) Award.

Sponsored by the Minnesota State High School League, the AAA Award honors high school seniors who have excelled in the classroom, on the athletic field, and in fine arts. Students who are nominated must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 or better, participate in MSHSL sponsored fine arts and athletic activities, and comply with the MSHSL's Student Code of Conduct.

AAA Award recipients are selected through a multi-level process that involves League member schools, the League's administrative regions, and a special committee of educators, business leaders, and members from the fine arts and athletic communities. Regional winners will be announced at the AAA Banquet in Mahnomen on February 11, 2015.

The top two AAA Award candidates from each region will be recognized at an on-court ceremony during the Minnesota Boys' State Basketball Tournament in March. League officials will announce two state award recipients – one girl and one boy from both a Class A and a Class AA school – during the on-court ceremony. Each state award recipient will receive a four-year \$1,000 scholarship.

Logan Klegstad is a member of the Badger High School Chapter of the National Honor Society, basketball and track teams. As member of the band and choir, he has won awards for his solo and ensemble performances at MSHSL music contests. Logan is an active member of FIRST Robotics, FCCLA, and One-Act play. He is planning to attend the Association Free Lutheran Bible School in the fall. Logan is the son of Jason and Amie Klegstad of Roseau.


In addition to being a member of the National Honor Society, Madison Truscinski participates in volleyball and is a member of the golf team that has made two consecutive state tournament appearances. Active in both band and choir, she has won multiple awards at MSHSL instrumental and vocal solo and ensemble contests. Madison is also involved in FIRST Robotics, One-Act play, and FCCLA. She is planning to attend St. Catherine's University to major in physical therapy. Madison is the daughter of Alan and Valerie Truscinski of Greenbush.

Ramp-Up January 2015

Ramp-Up for Readiness Students will investigate the following topics during the month of January. Parents should feel free to use these as specific discussion starters about the Ramp-Up activities and workshops held during the month.

<u>**GRADE 6**</u> – *Defining Your Dreams*. Part of getting ready for postsecondary education is helping students to think about their dreams and aspirations, and to starting thinking about how they can get there. Building this belief at this stage of their lives is one of the most important aspects of college and career readiness at this age.

WORKSHOP: Why Postsecondary Education – Students learn some of the benefits of having a postsecondary education and begin to explore general information on institutions through using the Minnesota Career Information System website.

<u>GRADE 7</u> – Working and Learning with Peers. In this unit the peer interactions that can sometimes get in the way of learning are addressed by sharing positive ways to interact. The "soft skills" that are important in both the workplace and school are stressed – being on time, having a strong work ethic, and valuing diversity. *Growth Mindset*. Students learn that abilities and intelligence is not fixed and can change through effort and willingness to learn.

WORKSHOP: Growth Mindset

<u>GRADE 8</u> – *Preparing for High School.* This unit is to help students prepare for course selection as they will begin high school in the fall. Not only will students be discussing required coursework and available electives, but co-curricular opportunities as well. *WORKSHOP*: Understanding Your EXPLORE Test Results

<u>GRADE 9</u> – *Identifying Internal and External Supports*. Students identify what they see as their won assets by filling out a checklist. They then identify was they can use their assets to overcome obstacles. *Effective Ways to Study*. This unit identifies 10 study strategies that students can use to make them more academically successful.

<u>GRADE 10</u> – Defining *Ways to Pay for College*. This unit describes the ways that students can and do pay for college. The importance of grants, scholarships, student loans and work study jobs are discussed. *WORKSHOP*: Financing Postsecondary Education.

<u>GRADE 11</u> – *Finding Scholarships*. Student finds out how to look for and apply to receive scholarship money available to help them pay for postsecondary education. *Choosing Classes to Maintain Momentum*. This unit is intended to encourage students to take challenging courses to avoid the "senior slump". Students will review potential course options and well as receive information about concurrent enrollment courses.

WORKSHOP: Envisioning Possible Self.

<u>GRADE 12</u> – Setting and Sticking to Great Goals. In this unit the idea of goal setting is revisited. Research about how people perceive goals and the obstacles and benefits of reaching those goals is introduced, along with solutions for helping students to think about how they will approach obstacles so that the benefits can be realized. Understanding College Grading. Student will gain a general idea of how college grading can be different from what they have experienced in high school. Students will learn of the importance of syllabi and GPA in college.

WORKSHOP: Completing the FAFSA – Students will begin the FAFSA completion process online.





2014 was a successful year for the Badger School District. Our enrollment continues to remain strong and has even experienced growth from the previous year. Perhaps the greatest achievement was our elementary school being recognized as a "REWARD" school by the Minnesota Department of Education. The "REWARD" designation recognizes the top 15% academic achieving schools within the State of Minnesota.

The "new year" promises many exciting opportunities, challenges, and successes for the Badger School District. Currently, the FIRST robotics season officially began on January 3rd and our students are working diligently right now to meet the engineering challenges they are faced with.
